Honorary Chairwoman — Linda O'Hare

Linda O'Hare is a Montana gal who spent much of her childhood camping and hiking in the hills and mountains around Helena and Lewistown. She earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in Business Education and Office Administration from the University of Montana, Missoula. She also met her husband, Tim, while in Missoula and taught business classes at Sentinel HS for 3 years. Next, they moved to Lewistown where they raised their two children and Linda worked in the HS office for 16 years.

Linda and Tim moved to Hope, Idaho, in 2002. Linda became the Administrative Assistant for Bonner Soil & Water Conservation District in 2003. She says "I had always spent a lot of time outdoors and loved it, but this job gave me the opportunity to learn more about our natural resources." This is quite an understatement: Not only did she serve on the Forestry Contest steering committee, which included supervising Registration and Scoring during the contest, every spring she also coordinated and delivered tree seedlings to area landowners, helped sponsor the Pend Oreille Water Festival for all 5th graders in Bonner County, organized the Fly Fishing Film Festival with Trout Unlimited, and administered the county Boat Inspection Program. In addition, she administered grants for streambank stabilization, road erosion, Waterlife Discovery Center, Pack River Watershed Council, Lakes Commission, Lake Assist, and the willow nursery.

Linda says "I'll always remember my first Idaho State Forestry Contest in 2004 and my joy in being a part of it. It takes a huge amount of organization, and has grown and changed every year since. My district is a sponsor, so I was immersed into the preparations right away. It's a great day for education for our youth, a great opportunity for forestry professionals and educators to gather, and it has a huge impact on students continuing their education in forestry." Linda retired from BSWCD in September of 2017 but we are very thankful that she is still willing to help with the Idaho State Forestry Contest.
